## <u>Parent Engagement Increases Student Academic</u> Achievement and Makes for a Stronger School!

According to the recent MetLife Survey of the American Teacher, teachers, parents and students all agree that parent engagement in schools has increased over the past 25 years. Many studies have shown that students with involved parents earn higher grades, achieve higher test scores, earn more credits, and have better attendance. Parent engagement also increases a student's ability to graduate high school. However, the MetLife survey also noted that parent engagement remains a challenge for many schools (Edutopia.com, 2014).

This school year, ACE Charter High School has increased the opportunities for parents to be more engaged. One easy way is to monitor student progress, grades, and attendance through the online **PowerSchool Parent Login**. Ms. Stinnett recently graduated from the "Villa Maria University" program at the central Tucson Villa Maria Care Center where success is measured not by credit hours but by courage, curiosity, and communication - measures that ACE is instilling in our students. Ms. Stinnett shared what life was like growing up during World Wars I and II, her time in Cuba sparring with Fidel Castro, and the importance of education and healthy living - no smoking, limited alcohol, and lots of fruits and vegetables (no processed food).
